- 2. Make sure your child is on time for school every day (Remember, our school day begins promptly at 8:15 am)



Odyssey of the Mind 2016-2017

What is Odyssey of the Mind (OOTM)?

OOTM "is an international educational program that provides creative problem-solving opportunities for students from kindergarten through college. Team members apply their creativity to solve problems that range from building mechanical devices to presenting their own interpretation of literary classics. They then bring their solutions to competition on the local, state, and World level. Thousands of teams from throughout the U.S. and from about 25 other countries participate in the program."¹

Who can participate?

All Johnson students are eligible to help form teams! Each team is made up of 5-7 Johnson students. A team cannot compete if it has more or less! Parents and coaches are NOT allowed to give ideas, so the team members must make the commitment to create, design, build, and execute the plans. Parents and coaches can help guide with safe practices and handling big equipment, but this is primarily student driven.

What is the time commitment?

Odyssey teams work together to come up with meeting times outside of school hours as well as project timelines/goals in order to get their projects complete. This can mean meeting every so often, or up to a few times per week, especially as the competition day comes closer. Team members should also be willing to work on their projects individually at home, as a lot of time goes into building the props, costumes and pieces to bring the entire project together. All team members must commit to being at the State Competition on Saturday, March 18, 2017.

There is an optional Team Building Workshop "Odyssey Day" on December 3rd as well. Each team can decide if they would like to attend this workshop.

What is the main goal of OOTM?

The teams will choose from a list of 5 projects and compete in a state competition on March 18, 2017. This is the major portion of the project. The second part is a Spontaneous Problem that the students will not know anything about until the day of the competition. This is a fun time for the teams to work together to figure out a brand new problem, being scored on their teamwork, creativity, and completion.

What else does a team need?

Each team must have a Coach (two preferably), a Volunteer, and a Judge. Coaches will lead the meetings and help keep the teams focused without giving them help to solve their problems. Coaches also coordinate the meeting scheduling and complete all paperwork necessary for team registration. There are 2 optional (but encouraged) Coach Training dates, November 5th or January 7th. In addition, a Volunteer and a Judge needs to give their time on the day of the state competition. Without these, teams are fined for non-compliance with rules. Volunteers are expected to serve for a few hours either the night before or the day of the competition. You can choose your time and location typically to try to work around your teams' competition times. Judges will need to attend a Judge Training on Saturday March 4th. They will commit to judge a block of time for a certain project or area. Scheduling can be a bit trickier so sometimes a judge is not able to see some or all of their teams' competitions.

How much does OOTM cost?

The program cost is about \$60 per student. In addition, there will be expenses for props, costumes, etc. however it is expected that the majority of these items are recycled. Each problem has a maximum dollar amount that can be spent towards solving the problem.

How do I sign my student up?

Depending on interest and the number of volunteers, there will be a lottery to form teams. If there are enough students to form a team, the student of a Coach, Volunteer or Judge will have a guaranteed spot on the team. Fill out the attached interest form (do not include payment at this time) and we will create teams based on the interest. Forms must be received by Friday, October 7, 2016.
