Odyssey of the Mind 2017-2018

What is Odyssey of the Mind (OOTM)?

OOTM "is an international educational program that provides creative problem-solving opportunities for students from kindergarten through college. Team members apply their creativity to solve problems that range from building mechanical devices to presenting their own interpretation of literary classics. They then bring their solutions to competition on the local, state, and World level. Thousands of teams from throughout the U.S. and from about 25 other countries participate in the program."

Who can participate?

All students are eligible to help form teams! Each team is made up of 5-7 students. A team cannot compete if it has more or less! Parents and coaches are NOT allowed to give ideas, so the team members must make the commitment to create, design, build, and execute the plans. Parents and coaches can help guide with safe practices and handling big equipment, but this is primarily student driven.

What is the time commitment?

Odyssey teams work together to come up with meeting times outside of school hours as well as project timelines/goals in order to get their projects complete. This can mean meeting every so often, or up to a few times per week, especially as the competition day comes closer. Team members should also be willing to work on their projects individually at home, as a lot of time goes into building the props, costumes and pieces to bring the entire project together. All team members must commit to being at the State Competition on Saturday, March 17, 2018.

There is an optional Team Building Workshop "Odyssey Day" on November 11th as well. Each team can decide if they would like to attend this workshop.

What is the main goal of OOTM?

The teams will choose from a list of 5 projects and compete in a state competition on March 17, 2018. This is the major portion of the project. The second part is a Spontaneous Problem that the students will not know anything about until the day of the competition. This is a fun time for the teams to work together to figure out a brand new problem, being scored on their teamwork, creativity, and completion.

What else does a team need?

Each team <u>must have a Coach</u> (two preferably), a Volunteer, and a Judge. Coaches will lead the meetings and help keep the teams focused without giving them help to solve their problems. Coaches also coordinate the meeting scheduling and complete all paperwork necessary for team registration. There are 2 optional (but encouraged) Coach Training dates, October 28th or January 6th. Coaches must also complete a background check through the Bethel Public Schools.

In addition, a Volunteer and a Judge needs to give their time on the day of the state competition. Without these, teams are fined for non-compliance with rules. Volunteers are expected to serve for a few hours either the night before or the day of the competition. You can choose your time and location typically to try to work around your teams' competition times. Judges will need to attend a Judge Training on Saturday March 3rd. They will commit to judge a block of time for a certain project or area. Scheduling can be a bit trickier so often a judge is not able to see some or all of their teams' competitions.

How much does OOTM cost?

The program cost is about \$60 per student. In addition, there will be expenses for props, costumes, etc. however it is expected that the majority of these items are recycled. Each problem has a maximum dollar amount that can be spent towards solving the problem.

How do I sign my student up?

Depending on interest and the number of volunteers, there will be a lottery to form teams. If there are enough students to form a team, the student of a Coach, Volunteer or Judge will have a guaranteed spot on the team. Fill out the attached interest form (do not include payment at this time) and we will create teams based on the interest. Forms must be received by Friday, October 20, 2017.

The preschool team includes the Supervisor of Special Education, Preschool Special Education Teachers, Speech/Language Pathologist, Occupational Therapist, Physical Therapist and School Social Worker.

Boys and Girls Basketball League

REGISTRATION FOR IN-TOWN BASKETBALL WILL BEGIN ON SEPTEMBER 5th, ONLINE OR AT THE PARKS AND RECREATION OFFICE AND WILL END ON NOVEMBER 10TH

The Bethel Parks and Recreation Department is taking basketball registration for boys and girls in grades 2-8. The program is designed to introduce the game of basketball in a fun and positive environment. The season will begin on Saturday, December 2nd and will run through the end of February 2018. Schedule is subject to change based on registrations.

Practice days/times for grades 2 – 8 are subject to coaches and gym availability. The coaches' only meeting will take place on Saturday, November 11th for team selection and players will be contacted before November 28th regarding team placement. **Coaches are still needed please contact the office.**

PLEASE NOTE: THERE WILL BE NO COACH OR TEAMMATE REQUESTS HONORED AS IT IS TOO DIFFICULT TO COORDINATE WITH APPROXIMATELY 500 PARTICIPANTS. We will ask days that your child cannot practice, but there is NO guarantee we can accommodate the request as practices are based on coaches availability.

BOYS LEAGUE

<u>Senior League:</u> A league for boys in grades 7 & 8. All games will be played on Saturdays at 8:00, 9:00, 10:00, 11:00, or 12:00. Full court games will take place at Bethel High School.

<u>Junior League:</u> A league for boys in grades 5 & 6. All games will be played on Saturdays at 8:00, 9:00, 10:00, or 11:00 a.m. at Bethel Middle School.

4th Grade League: A league for boys in 4th grade. All games will be played on Saturdays between 8-11 a.m. depending on number of teams at Johnson School.

<u>3rd Grade League:</u> A league for boys in 3rd grade. All games will be played on Saturdays between 10-2 p.m. depending on number of teams at Johnson School.

2nd Grade League: A league for boys in 2nd grade. All games will be played on Saturdays between 10-2 p.m. depending on number of teams at Berry School.

GIRLS LEAGUE

<u>Senior League</u>: A league for girls in grades 6 - 8. If enough players are registered teams will be created. If we do not get enough players to form a minimum of 4 teams, we will run a two hour clinic from 8-10 a.m. every Saturday at the Municipal Center.

<u>Junior League:</u> A league for girls in grades 4 & 5. All games will be played on Saturdays at 8:00, 9:00, or 10:00 a.m. at Bethel Middle School.

2nd and 3rd Grade: A league for girls in grades 2 & 3. All games will be played on Saturdays at 8:00, 9:00, or 10:00 a.m. depending on number of teams at Berry School.

HIGH SCHOOL LEAGUE

9TH-12TH Grade: This is a Bethel Parks & Recreation basketball league for high school boys and girls. Open gym will begin in December, and games in January. Times will be announced in late November. Open gym and all games are at the Bethel Municipal Center. All Games are played on Sundays. First open gym will be Sunday, Dec. 3rd from 3:00-5:00 p.m. in the Municipal Center. We will also have weeknight open gyms on Tuesdays & Thursdays from 8:30-10:00 p.m., dates for weeknights will be given out on December 3rd.
