

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Tips to be a Finalist in this Year's Culinary Competition

Have your eye on the prize? Here are some tips that may help!

- 1. **<u>Be original</u>** You don't have to be like everyone else. Consider putting a new twist on your favorite Asian Fusion recipe.
- 2. <u>Be creative</u> A student once submitted a recipe for "dill cookies!" Sounds terrible, but they were actually great! Don't TRY to be too weird, but we love to see recipes that are different!
- 3. Don't do recipes that are too easy or too complicated.
- 4. This <u>doesn't</u> have to be your own, original recipe. You can get them off the Internet or anywhere, but try to alter it slightly to make it your own!
- 5. SORRY, only <u>ONE</u> person can make each recipe at the competition.
- 6. We are looking for <u>healthy Asian Fusion food</u> recipes, so try to avoid recipes with a lot of sugar or fat in them.
- 7. At the main competition, judges will consider the following 6 criteria:
 - Taste
 - Originality
 - Ease of Preparation
 - Healthy Attributes
 - Kid Appeal
 - Plate Presentation

The use of one or more of the following ingredients will earn up to 3 bonus points at the judging:

Ski Jumping: Read a type of book that you don't normally read. For example, if you usually read

fiction, try a non-fiction.

Snowboard (halfpipe): Read a graphic novel Speed Skating: Read a short story or magazine

Olympic Coach: Read a book about an olympic athlete

Olympic Fan: Read 10 additional minutes each day for 5 days. For example, if you normally read

20 minutes, read 30 minutes each day for 5 days.

To maximize time at the beach, a guide from the aquarium will come to Johnson for pre-visit meetings. The pre-visits will introduce students to the activities and equipment to ensure they get the most of their shoreline experience

Students can travel to and from school as usual

Cost: \$16

This covers the cost of transportation and the visit itself

What will they do?

Students will rotate through stations around the beach to learn about the different habitats of the intertidal zones. They will explore food webs, balanced ecosystems, structures and adaptations of organisms, various scientific tools used to collect data, and human impact on the shoreline. The station investigations will be focused around 5th grade NGSS standards and will complement our spring study of food webs and ecosystems well.
