Our children's connection to media is everywhere, coming from more sources and more screens than we probably remember when we were kids: TV, movies, and video games, handheld games, computers, cell phones, iPads, iPods, watches, etc. There are many wonderful uses for media that provide conveniences and education for our families and us. There are also dangers in media use that as parents and educators, we are tasked to protect our children from. With all of the amazing advances in technology, we cannot forget to make advances in how we protect our children from media that is not age-appropriate.

It's important to remember that children's brains are not fully developed, specifically the part of the brain (pre-frontal cortex) responsible for critical thinking, judgment, problem solving, and impulse control. When a child or adolescent views media showing violence, sexual content, or harmful stereotypes, their own ideas, feelings, and behaviors are impacted. Without some guidance from a trusted grown-up, repeated exposure to these kinds of media may lead to an increase in aggression and a decrease in empathy.

Quick tips for setting media guidelines:

- Limit the amount of screen time to 1-2 hours a day (or less if you notice it is negatively impacting your child).
- Model screen-free times/activities (like dinner time, for example).
- Keep children's bedrooms free of screen media (no TV, game systems, laptops, iPads, cell phones, etc.).
- Preview media that your child is interested in before you allow them to view/play it.
- Co-view media (if appropriate) with your child and discuss the content this will help them develop critical thinking skills.
- Do your research about social media websites. Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, Musically, and Snap Chat <u>are not appropriate</u> for 4th and 5th grade students. Remember, these sites have terms of use, which are typically for ages 13 and up.
- Stick to the rating recommendations. They exist for a reason.
- Use your parental judgment. Your children are counting on you!



Financial Aid

Many people find themselves facing temporary or even long term financial hardship, making it seem impossible to afford the costs of an activity for their child/children. If you would like to apply for a partial scholarship, please let Parks and Recreation know you need help.

Assistance is available by making an **appointment** to see the Director of Social Services, Megan Alworth-Khazadian. This can be done by calling 203-794-8537 or by sending an email to Megan at alworth-khazadianm@bethel-ct.gov. You must provide proof of residency as well as financial documentation to be considered for financial aid. After doing this, please bring the letter from Social Services to the Parks and Rec. Dept. to register your child for camp. **Please**Note: Effective January 2016 we will only be offering assistance for **one class/program per child** for each Parks and Recreation Session: Winter, Spring, Summer and Fall. Regarding Camp assistance, partial scholarships may be available for working families in need of childcare.
