Over the past few weeks I have had several conversations with students about how to make and keep friends. As you know, friendships at this point in life are so important, because tweens are becoming more independent, and they seek the acceptance and support of their friends.

Below are a few simple strategies that will help you guide your tween through these difficult social years. The goal is for your tween to make friends, become a good friend, and to learn to be comfortable with whom they are.

Some helpful hints:

1. Encourage Healthy Friendships

Take the time to point out what makes a good friend, as well as how to be a good friend to someone else. Be sure your tween understands that gossiping about a friend isn't very friendly, and that maintaining friendships require a little work. Point out what you like about her friends. You could say, "I like how your friends call you when you're sick to see how you're doing" or "I like it when your friends offer to help you clean your room after a sleepover." Help your tween foster friendships by including them occasionally in family activities, or inviting them over for family movie or game night. Also, be sure your tween understands that there's no substitute for one-on-one time together, and that texting friends isn't the same as spending time with them in person.

2. Help Children Make Friends

Tweens don't always understand that their behaviors and the way they present themselves may be turning potential friends away. Help your child to understand that a person's attitude, and even affect may be sending the wrong message to peers. You might consider: Does your child smile and greet others? What does your child's body language tell people? Does your child look peers in the eye or gaze towards the floor? Does your child respect other people's opinions and talents, or resent them for being different from or for having abilities your child doesn't?

3. Don't Push Popularity

You may have wanted to be in the "in crowd" when you were young, but didn't quite make it. Don't let your own baggage impact your child. Be careful that you don't push your child to join a certain group of friends, or take part in certain "cool" activities because you think your child will be happier that way. Allow your tween to discover activities that are fun, and to choose friends who are supportive of your child and provide a positive influence.

4. Keep Your Child Active

Keeping your tween <u>involved in activities</u> is a good way to make friends with similar interests, as well as expand your child's circle of friends.

5. Expect Drama

Tweens can be moody, <u>angry</u>, and difficult at times. All of these emotions can interfere with <u>tween friendships</u>. Expect some friendships to be volatile from time to time. When they are, help your tween <u>deal with emotions</u> and encourage ways to calm down before approaching a friend about their problems. Role-play with your tween, to help your child develop his/her problem-solving skills. Help your child try to understand the problem from the friend's point of view.

6. Be a Good Listener

Listen to your child every day as they talk about school, the bus, sports, or parties. Attentive listening will provide you with a lot of information about the friendships and their behavior. Take quick action if you suspect negative behaviors are taking place.

7. Encourage Self Expression

You want your tween to enjoy healthy friendships, but you also want your child to have a mind of his/her own. Teach your tween that sometimes friends can disagree, or have different interests, beliefs, or tastes in clothing, music, and hobbies. Encourage your child to have the confidence to say "no" to a friend who is trying might be influencing them negatively.




